


Explore the Trades

You'll learn the basics and get a sense of what trade you want to pursue. You'll also gain practical skills and even complete certifications that employers are looking for.







Explore the Trades - Skills

PROGRAM DETAILS:

- 120-hour high school course for students in Grade 9-12
- Usually delivered at school
- 5,000 participants per year
- Consists of four modules (approx. 30 hours each) that introduce students to trades careers through hands-on learning
 - 1. Core module
 - 2. Trades module
 - 3. Trades module
 - 4. Another trades module or a complementary module like robotics, drafting etc.



Explore the Trades - Sampler

PROGRAM DETAILS:

- 300+ hour (10-12 week) program covering 5+ different trades
- Usually delivered at a Post-Secondary
- In depth experience in each trade delivered in partnership with a post secondary school
- Workforce certificates included: First Aid, Fall Protection, Forklift Operator etc.
- Modules are selected from a pre-approved list to meet local/regional needs based on economics, job opportunities and interest
- May include a non-paid work experience
- ~750 participants per year







Train in Trades

GET A HEAD START ON YOUR TECHNICAL TRADES TRAINING

Attend a trades training class at a local high school, a partner post-secondary institution or a SkilledTradesBC certified training facility.

You'll learn from skilled instructors and earn credits that count towards your high school diploma and Level 1 of your technical trades training.

GET ON-THE-JOB TRAINING AS A YOUTH APPRENTICE


Get ahead on the work-based training of a trade apprenticeship while you're still in high school.

Not only will you take home a pay cheque, you'll earn up to **16 credits** towards your high school diploma, log **480 training hours** towards your trade credential and maybe even earn a \$1,000 scholarship.

What is an Apprenticeship?

A trade apprenticeship is how you gain the knowledge and skills you need for a career in your trade.

Most apprenticeships take about four years to complete.

You'll spend approximately six to eight weeks per year in the classroom or shop learning from an instructor. The rest of the year, you'll learn, working on a job site alongside experienced tradespeople and getting paid to do it.

20% CLASSROOM TRAINING

In a classroom or shop at a university, college or private institution.

80% WORK-BASED TRAINING

Earn while you learn on a job site, working alongside your employer sponsor and experienced tradespeople in your field.
