



PLUMBER

Occupation Description

"Plumber" means a person who installs, alters or repairs any plumbing system including all work usually done by a journeyperson plumber governed by the BC Plumbing Code.

Regulations concerning the planning, installation, maintenance and inspection of sewage treatment systems may vary by jurisdiction. Additional certification may be required in some jurisdictions to allow plumbers to plan and perform work on these systems.

Pathways to Certification

In BC, an individual can become certified as a Plumber by completing the Plumber program or by challenging the certification. Apprenticeship programs are for individuals who have an employer to sponsor them and challenge programs are for individuals who have extensive experience working in the occupation and wish to challenge the certification.

Youth can begin an apprenticeship in high school through the Youth Train in Trades or Youth Work in Trades programs. The Youth Work in Trades program is available for any trade if an employer is willing to sponsor the student. Trades offered through the Youth Train in Trades vary by region; contact your local school district to find out which technical training programs are being offered through the Youth Train in Trades program in your region.

Foundation programs, where available, provide adults and youth who do not have work experience nor employer sponsorship with an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills needed to enter the occupation. Individuals who wish to enroll in a Foundation program must register directly with the training provider.

Recommended Education

The following education is recommended for apprentices entering this occupation. These are not prerequisites, but rather a desired level of skill or knowledge that will contribute to success in the industry.

 Grade 12 or equivalent including English 12, Algebra 11 or Trade Mathematics 11, and Physics 11 or Science & Technology 11

SkilledTradesBC Registration


Individuals who wish to begin an apprenticeship in this program must register with SkilledTradesBC along with their sponsors. Application forms are available from the SkilledTradesBC website.

Those who wish to challenge the Plumber certification must complete the Plumber Challenge Package and submit it to SkilledTradesBC. Challenge applications are assessed for proof of workplace hours and scope of experience prior to acceptance of the individual into the challenge pathway.




Apprenticeship Pathway

It can also be met through approved alternative training models (e.g., distance education, online, part-time) and/or level challenge where these options are available.


