Subject: Level 1 Standardized Level Exam (SLE) Launch

Effective Date: November 1, 2019

Summary: ITA is introducing standardized exams for Level 1 of the Lather (Interior Systems

Mechanic) (Wall and Ceiling Installer) program. Classes of level 1 apprentice technical training that begin on or after **November 1**, **2019** will be required to sit the exam. The

exam will contribute 20% to an apprentice's final mark.

An Exam Weighting Chart is available for the L1 SLE on ITA's website at https://www.itabc.ca/program/lather-interior-systems-mechanic-wall-and-ceiling-installer in the box titled *Standardized Level Exams*. This chart shows the approximate

weighting per General Area of Competency (GAC).

Rationale: ITA has implemented Standardized Level Exams as part of an assessment strategy to

ensure consistent outcomes at each program level for apprentices throughout BC.

General Information

Scheduling Exams:

Exams are to be requested by training providers via the usual ITA procedure. Training providers are required to complete an ITA Exam Request Form six-to-eight weeks prior to the scheduled exam date. Training providers are encouraged to identify courses using the Session ID to aid in confirmation of exam type. ITA will provide an invigilator for these exams.

Calculating Final Percentage Scores For ITA Level Exams:

Process - effective October 1, 2014

- ITA administers the SLE, records the mark in Direct Access, and reports it to the school. The apprentice is **not** notified when the SLE mark is entered.
- Training providers weight and blend the in-school (80%) and SLE (20%) marks to produce a final mark for the Level (or as indicated in the Assessment Guidelines). That final, blended mark is reported to ITA by the school and recorded in Direct Access.
- Direct Access reports the school's final blended mark for the Level to the



apprentice as a single percentage score.

Once the final Level mark is entered in Direct Access, the system performs a
reverse calculation using the SLE mark to determine the in-school mark. All
three marks are stored in the apprentice's record, but only the final Level mark
is reported on the ITA transcript.

A percentage score of 70% or greater is required to pass when the final in-school percentage score and the final ITA Level exam percentage score are blended.
