



AUTOMOTIVE PAINTER (AUTOMOTIVE REFINISHING TECHNICIAN)

Occupation Description

Automotive Painters (Automotive Refinishing Technicians) work on the surfaces of motor vehicles, primarily in restoring vehicle finishes once body work has been completed. Some of the duties that an Automotive Painter completes include: removing layers of sub-coating; matching colours and mixing paints; preparing metal surfaces for painting by spot filling, sanding, and masking; applying primers, primer surfacers, colour coats, and clearcoats; and cleaning and polishing painted surfaces including removing and replacing decals.

Pathways to Certification

In BC, an individual can become certified as an Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) by completing the Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) program or by challenging the certification. Apprenticeship programs are for individuals who have an employer to sponsor them and challenge programs are for individuals who have extensive experience working in the occupation and wish to challenge the certification.

Recommended and/or Required Education

The following education is recommended for apprentices entering this occupation. These are not prerequisites, but rather a desired level of skill or knowledge that will contribute to success in the industry.

- Grade 10 or equivalent including English 10, Math 10, and Science 10
- Preferred: Grade 12

SkilledTradesBC Registration

Individuals who wish to begin an apprenticeship in this program must register with SkilledTradesBC along with their sponsor. Application forms for all programs are available from the SkilledTradesBC website. Online registration is also available for most programs through the SkilledTradesBC website.

Note that apprentices holding Automotive Refinishing Prep Technician certification who wish to achieve Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) certification must re-register as an apprentice in the Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) apprenticeship program.

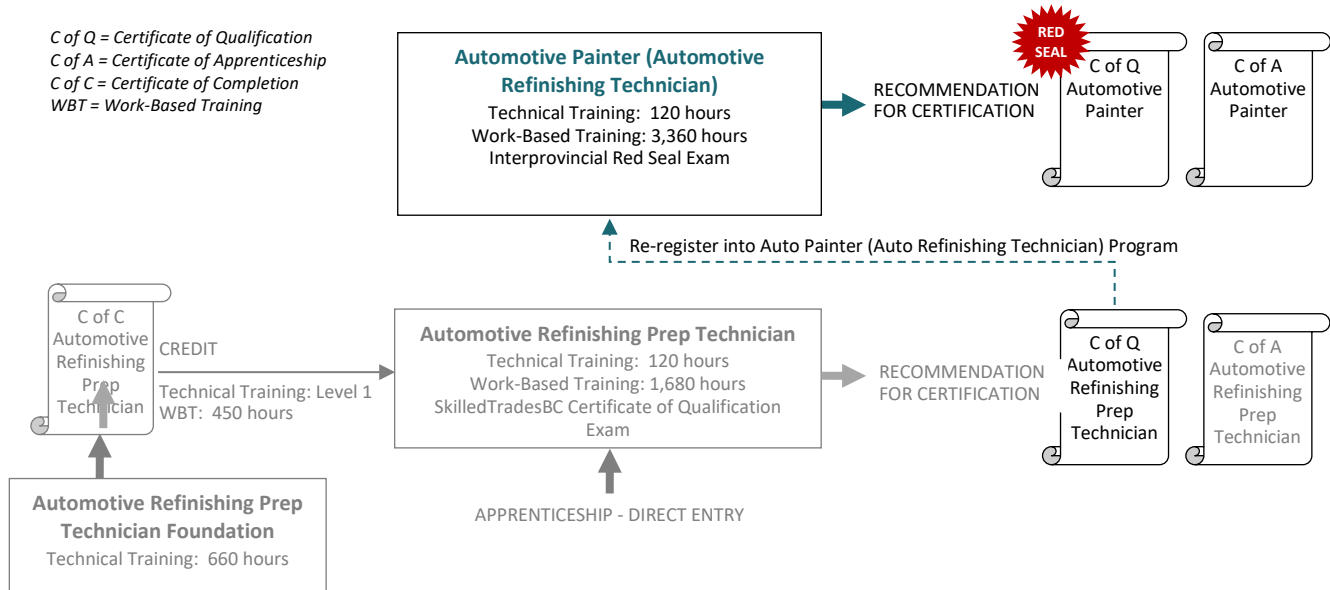
Those who wish to challenge the Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) certification must complete the Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) Challenge Application and submit it to SkilledTradesBC. Challenge applications are assessed for proof of workplace hours and scope of experience prior to acceptance of the individual into the Challenge pathway. Note that Automotive Refinishing Prep Technician certification is not required in order to challenge the Automotive Painter (Automotive Refinishing Technician) certification.

Program Duration Duration varies depending on how training is delivered, but the program generally takes 2 years to complete.
 The technical training requirement is typically met through block-release training (full-time, at school) delivered by a SkilledTradesBC-approved training provider. It can also be met through approved alternative training models (e.g., distance education, online, part-time) and/or level challenge where these options are available.

Sign-off Authority Credentials eligible to sign-off on the Recommendation for Certification:

- Automotive Refinishing Technician – Certificate of Qualification
- Automotive Painter – Interprovincial Red Seal endorsement
- Automotive Collision Repair Technician – Certificate of Qualification
- Motor Vehicle Body Repairer (Metal and Paint) – Interprovincial Red Seal endorsement
- SkilledTradesBC-issued letter authorizing supervision and sign-off of apprentices in this occupation

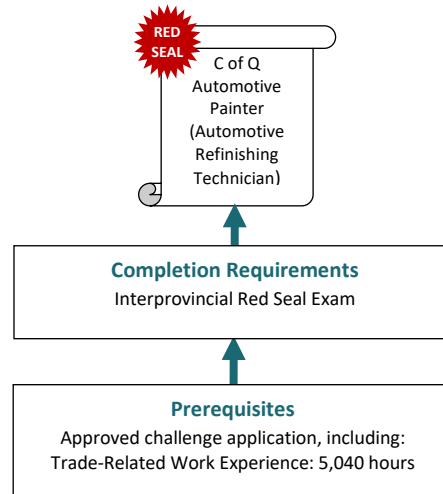
