



AUTOMOTIVE REFINISHING TECHNICIAN

Occupation Description

Automotive Refinishing Technicians work on the surfaces of motor vehicles, primarily in restoring vehicle finishes once body work has been completed. Some of the duties that an automotive refinishing technician completes include: removing layers of old coatings; matching colours and mixing paints; preparing surfaces for painting by spot filling, sanding, and masking; applying primers, primer surfacers, sealers, base coats, single-stage and clear coats; cleaning and polishing painted surfaces; and applying protective coatings.

Many Automotive Refinishing Technicians work in close contact with Auto Body and Collision Technicians who tend to work in multi-shop companies, independent or dealership auto body and collision shops. Automotive refinishing duties may overlap with Auto Body and Collision Technicians' duties, particularly in small shops. In larger places of employment, Automotive Refinishing Technicians likely work as specialists after body repairs have been completed. They may also work with estimators, partspersons, detailers, preppers, glass installers and production managers. While they may work as part of the repair team, Automotive Refinishing Technicians tend to work independently. They may work in the automotive, truck and transport, commercial transport, heavy equipment, motorcycle, specialty vehicle, aviation and aerospace sectors.

Pathways to Certification

In BC, an individual can become certified as an Automotive Refinishing Technician by completing the Automotive Refinishing Technician program or by challenging the certification. Apprenticeship programs are for individuals who have an employer to sponsor them and challenge programs are for individuals who have extensive experience working in the occupation and wish to challenge the certification.

Youth can begin an apprenticeship in high school through the Youth Train in Trades or Youth Work in Trades programs. The Youth Work in Trades program is available for any trade if an employer is willing to sponsor the student. Trades offered through the Youth Train in Trades vary by region; contact your local school district to find out which technical training programs are being offered through the Youth Train in Trades program in your region.

Foundation programs, where available, provide adults and youth who do not have work experience or employer sponsorship with an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills needed to enter the occupation. Individuals who wish to enroll in a Foundation program must register directly with the training provider.

Recommended and/or Required Education

The following education is **recommended** for apprentices entering this occupation. These are not prerequisites, but rather a desired level of skill or knowledge that will contribute to success in the industry.

- Grade 10 or equivalent including English 10, Math 10, and Science 10
- Preferred: Grade 12



SkilledTradesBC Registration

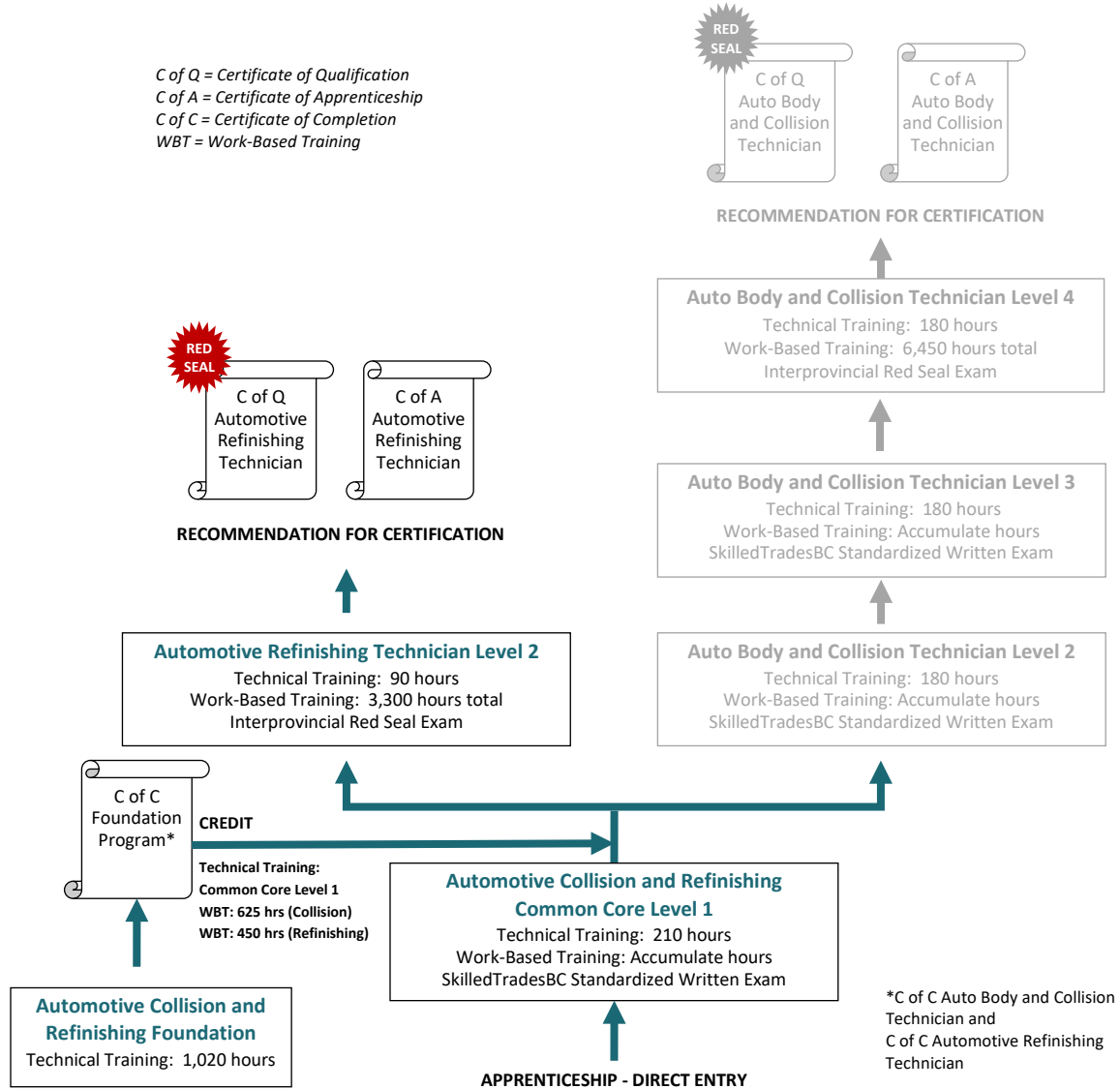
Individuals who wish to begin an apprenticeship in this program must register with SkilledTradesBC along with their sponsor. Application forms for all programs are available from the SkilledTradesBC website. Online registration is also available for most programs through the SkilledTradesBC website.

Those who wish to challenge the Automotive Refinishing Technician certification must complete the Automotive Refinishing Technician Challenge Application and submit it to SkilledTradesBC. Challenge applications are assessed for proof of workplace hours and scope of experience prior to acceptance of the individual into the Challenge pathway.



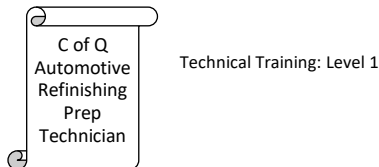
Apprenticeship Pathway

Program Duration

Duration varies depending on how training is delivered, but the program generally takes 2 years to complete.

The technical training requirement is typically met through block-release training (full-time, at school) delivered by a SkilledTradesBC-approved training provider. It can also be met through approved alternative training models (e.g., distance education, online, part-time) and/or level challenge where these options are available.

 - Automotive Collision Repair Technician – Certificate of Qualification
 - Motor Vehicle Body Repairer (Metal and Paint) – Interprovincial Red Seal endorsement
 - SkilledTradesBC-issued letter authorizing supervision and sign-off of apprentices in this occupation

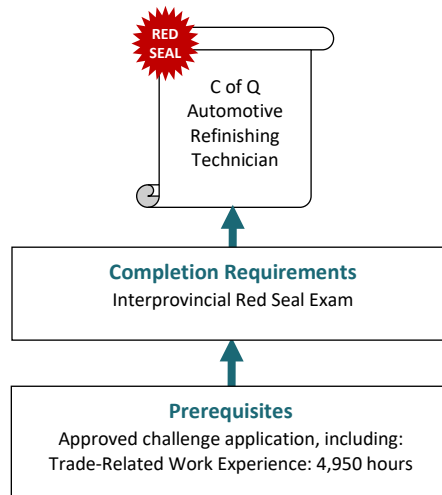

Program Duration

Duration varies depending on how training is delivered, but program generally takes 1,020 hours (34 weeks) to complete, assuming 30 hours in school per week.

Credit toward Apprenticeship

Individuals who complete the Automotive Collision and Refinishing Foundation Program will receive the following credit toward completion of the Auto Body and Collision Technician apprenticeship program and the Automotive Refinishing Technician apprenticeship program:

- Technical Training: Common Core Level 1
- Work-Based Training: 625 hours towards Auto Body and Collision Technician
- Work-Based Training: 450 hours toward Automotive Refinishing Technician
