Occupation Description

Marine Fitters work in the Shipbuilding and Repair Industry to cut and fit metal plates and other components in the process of assembling, constructing and repairing large vessels.

Marine Fitter is an endorsement on either the Metal Fabricator (Fitter) Certificate of Qualification or Boilermaker Red Seal Endorsement. For more information about Metal Fabricator (Fitter) or Boilermaker, please refer to the trade pages, available on the SkilledTradesBC website.

Pathways to Certification

In BC, an individual who is already a certified Metal Fabricator (Fitter) or Boilermaker can obtain a Marine Fitter Endorsement by completing the Marine Fitter program or by challenging the certification. Apprenticeship programs are for individuals who have an employer to sponsor them and challenge programs are for individuals who have extensive experience working in the occupation and wish to challenge the certification.

Prerequisite Credential

The following credential is **required** prior to enrolment in the technical training for this occupation. It will be verified by the training provider upon enrolment.

- Boilermaker Certificate of Qualification with Red Seal Endorsement OR
- Metal Fabricator (Fitter) Certificate of Qualification

SkilledTradesBC Registration


Individuals who wish to begin an apprenticeship in this program must register with SkilledTradesBC along with their sponsors. Those who wish to challenge the Marine Fitter Endorsement must complete the Marine Fitter Endorsement Challenge Application and submit it to SkilledTradesBC. Challenge applications are assessed for proof of workplace hours and scope of experience prior to acceptance of the individual into the Challenge pathway.
